最低系統要求

- Pentium® III 500 MHz 或更高版本處理器 (建議使用 Pentium 4 2.4 GHz 或更高版本，或是任一 AMD64/Intel® EM64T 處理器)
- 512 MB 實體 RAM (建議 1 GB)
- 3 GB 可用磁碟空間 (建議更大)
- 800 x 600 顯示器解析度 (建議 1024 x 768 或更高)

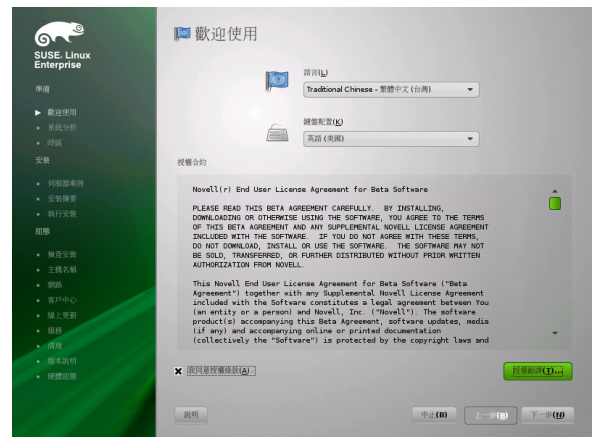
安裝 SUSE Linux Enterprise Desktop

如果您的機器上目前未安裝 Linux 系統或是您希望取代現有的 Linux 系統，請依照這些指示執行。

1. 將 SUSE Linux Enterprise Desktop DVD 插入光碟機，然後重新啟動電腦以啟動安裝程式。在配有傳統 BIOS 的機器上，您將看到下面所示的圖形開機螢幕。在配有 UEFI 的機器上，將會使用非圖形開機螢幕。支援對 UEFI 機器執行安全開機。



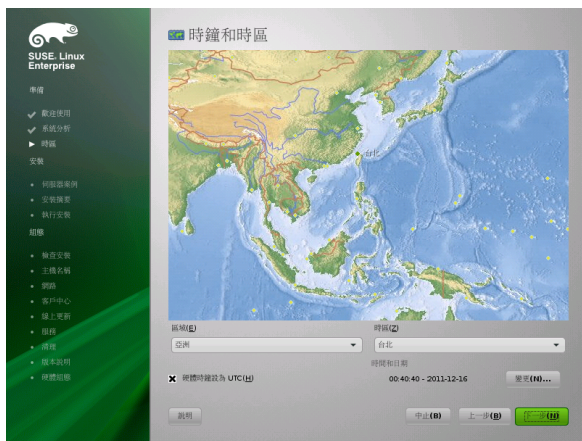
2. 在開機畫面中選取安裝，然後按 Enter。這會載入 SUSE Linux Enterprise Desktop 安裝程式，並以一般模式啟動安裝。



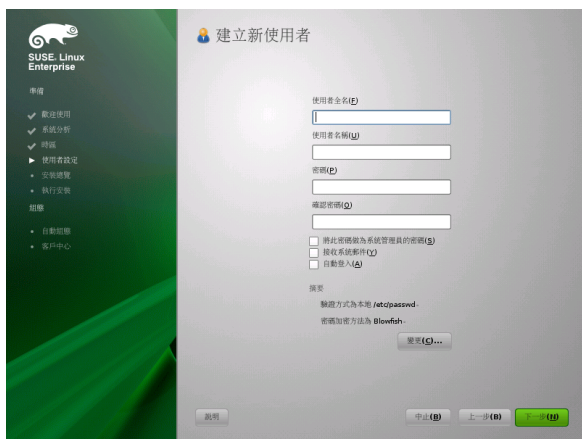
3. 選取安裝期間以及所安裝系統要使用的語言。
4. 閱讀授權合約，然後按一下是，我同意授權合約。按下一步繼續。



5. 選擇是要執行全新安裝還是從舊版 SUSE Linux Enterprise Desktop 進行更新。按下一步繼續。



6. 選取系統中使用的時鐘和時區。按下一步繼續。



7. 在使用者全名欄位中鍵入您的名字與姓氏，在使用者名稱欄位中鍵入您的登入名稱，在密碼欄位中鍵入您的密碼 (系統管理員所推薦的密碼)。

基於安全因素，您的密碼至少必須有 8 個字元長度，且應包含混合的大寫、小寫字母及數字。密碼的最大長度為 72 個字元，並且有大小寫之分。按下一步繼續。



8. 請輸入系統管理員帳戶 (稱為 root 的使用者) 的密碼。

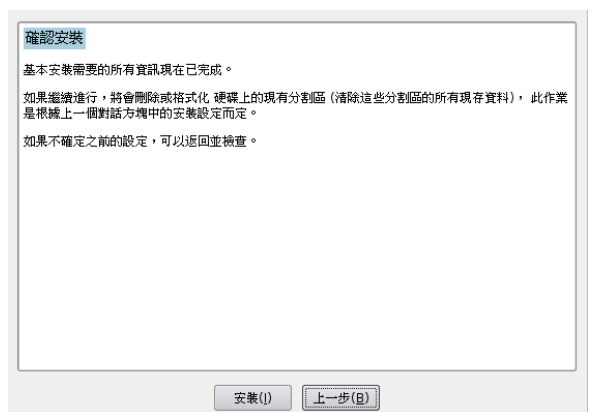
切勿忘記 root 的密碼！在此處輸入密碼後，無法再從系統取得密碼。只有在管理協助下才能重設該密碼。按下一步繼續。



9. 使用「安裝設定」螢幕檢視多個建議的安裝與磁碟分割選項，然後根據需要變更所需選項。

綜覽索引標籤包含有時需要手動介入的選項 (例如，磁碟分割與軟體)。進階索引標籤包含進階組態選項。

10. 按一下接受，接受所有必要的授權合約。您將看到以下畫面：



11. 按一下安裝，開始安裝。

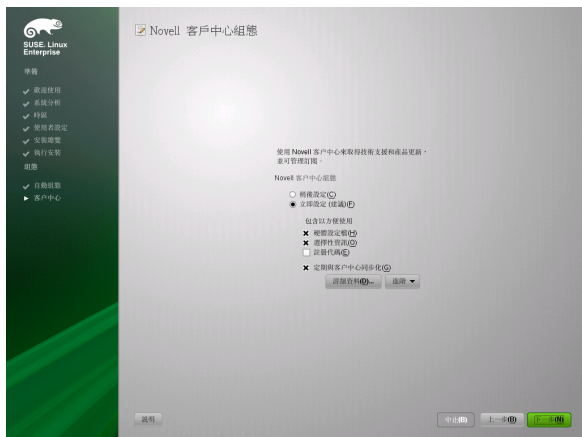


視系統效能與所選軟體範圍而定，安裝通常需要 15 至 30 分鐘。安裝期間，您可以檢視產品簡報、包含最新資訊的版本說明，也可以檢視詳細的安裝記錄。

12. 完成基本系統設定並安裝了所有選定軟體套件後，SUSE Linux Enterprise Desktop 安裝會開機進入新的 Linux 系統，執行自動系統組態。此常

式會嘗試設定網路和網際網路存取，並設定硬體。這個過程不需要任何互動。

13. 啟用系統以在「Novell 客戶中心組態」螢幕上進行線上更新。按一下立即設定> 下一步繼續註冊系統。



若要跳過此步驟，請按一下稍後設定> 下一步，繼續安裝。您可以在產品安裝完畢之後設定此選項。

14. 在「安裝已完成」畫面中按一下完成，關閉 SUSE Linux Enterprise Desktop 安裝並繼續進入登入畫面。



15. 輸入您的使用者名稱，然後在密碼欄位中輸入您的密碼。按 Enter 登入。

0. PREAMBLE

The purpose of this License is to make a manual, textbook, or other functional and useful document "free" in the sense of freedom: to assure everyone the effective freedom to copy and redistribute it, with or without modifying it, either commercially or noncommercially. Secondly, this License preserves for the author and publisher a way to get credit for their work, while not being considered responsible for modifications made by others.

This License is a kind of "copyleft", which means that derivative works of the document must themselves be free in the same sense. It complements the GNU General Public License, which is a copyleft license designed for free software.
